


WHEREAS, *Officer Heynes*, learned from bank employees and customers that the actor entered the bank wearing the ski mask and brandishing a gun, yelling for everyone to get on the floor. He then approached a teller ordering her at gunpoint to give him all the money in her drawer. He then moved down the row of tellers and to the drive-thru teller, demanding money from each of them, and

WHEREAS, *Officer Heynes* while positioned himself to monitor the northbound traffic on Route 51, he saw a vehicle fitting the description and at 1:12 P.M. (six minutes later), he along with Police Officer Adam Zeppuhar and Police Chief Robert Butelli, stopped the car in the 3500 block off Route 51. The suspects were taken into custody and among the evidence seized were the dye-stained clothing worn by the actor in the commission for the robbery and the gun he used. Witnesses identified the car, driver and clothing as the ones involved in the robbery. All the money taken was recovered. A trial was held on December 10, 2012 and both actors plead guilty. The robber was sentenced to prison and his accomplice was placed on probation.
