Other Police Business;

- The police department is still awaiting delivery of the new K-9 vehicle. When received, it will immediately go to Ibis Tek for the installation and graphics.
- The police department is actively working on an investigation with the U.S. Secret Service concerning false tax returns that were filed on several borough residents employed by UPMC.
- A new departmental written directive, No.63, was issued to all officers concerning procedures to be followed when making a Driving Under the Influence arrest.
- Officers DeLallo, Davidson, Rech, and Wagner have been scheduled to attend a two day training exercise in April entitled Basic Patrol Response to Active Shooter Training. This training is a joint exercise being conducted at the, Bishop McDowell Regional School.
- Officer William Meisel is scheduled in March for a Penndot re-certification class on the truck scales.
- Officer Josh Scott is schedule in March to attend a two day Interview and Interrogation class.
- On February 23rd, 2014, probationary officer, Farrell Wagner, made a traffic stop on Brownsville Road and was assisted by Sergeant

Matthew DeLallo and probationary officer, Carl Rech. This traffic stop resulted in the arrest of two individuals and the seizure of seven bricks of heroin with a street value over \$4,000.00, over \$8,000.00 in cash, and an illegal handgun. The incident is now an on-going investigation involving several other law enforcement agencies.

- I have prepared several new policies to be placed in the Brentwood Police Policy and Procedure Manual, and made amendments to update some current policies already in the manual. All additions and changes will be submitted to council for approval. The new policies are as follows: Off-Duty Firearms and Action Policy, Bias Free Policing Policy, Domestic Violence and PFA Enforcement Policy, and a revised Traffic Stop Policy.
