



- Has your pet ever run out of the yard?
- Has it been difficult to find them or have they been lost for days?
- If your pet does not have an identification microchip or loses their collar and tags, there's a chance that your pet may not be identified and safely returned to you.
- If a pet is turned in and unclaimed within 24 hours, the pet is sent to a contract dog/cat catcher & most likely euthanized within 48 hours.

BUT NOT IN BRENTWOOD OR BALDWIN!

With the help of caring police officers, we are trying to avoid this from happening.

Lost and stray animals in Brentwood, Baldwin and surrounding areas have a new "leash" on life!

Thanks to these dedicated police officers and Animal Advocates, lost family pets are being placed in foster care rather than going to animal control and euthanized.

Animal Advocates is a nonprofit, volunteer animal-rescue organization that places Pittsburgh area animals in foster homes until permanent homes can be found for them.

Here's how it works:

When an animal is found, police first check for owner tags or county license. If this is unsuccessful, officers use a scanner to check for a microchip. A microchip can simplify the process by giving the police department the name of a shelter or veterinarian who implanted it. Using that information, the officer can then track down the animal's owner.

If unsuccessful, police call Animal Advocates who will transport the animal to a veterinarian for a checkup, necessary vaccines and behavioral evaluation. Once the animal has received a clean bill of health, it is placed in a foster home.
